NON-PARTISAN HOTLINE TO HELP VOTERS & RESOLVE PROBLEMS**

October 29, 2010—Voters in Colorado continue to have questions about the logistics of voting. Just Vote! Colorado Election Protection is a nonpartisan resource dedicated to assisting Coloradans with voting questions. Experts can help voters understand their rights, verify their registration status, find their polling place, and resolve Election Day issues.

The goal of Just Vote! Colorado Election Protection is to protect legally registered Coloradans' right to vote and serve as a one-stop resource for voters. Voters will find answers to questions about voting or be directed to where they can find the answers.

The 2010 mid-term election has captured national attention, with record campaign spending across the political spectrum. While this election is less high-profile than the 2008 presidential election, problems persist. In particular, JVCEP is monitoring the following issues:

- ✓ Widespread voter registration problems;
- ✓ Ongoing confusion about the use of mail-ballots;
- ✓ Voter intimidation, including uniformed officers at polling places and targeted challenges to Latino voters' eligibility;

“The number of calls we’ve received during the early vote period demonstrates the need for a fast, user-friendly resource where voters can find basic information about voting,” noted Jenny Flanagan, Executive Director of Colorado Common Cause, part of JVCEP’s steering committee. “Instead of having to go to multiple sources to find answers, they can come to our website or call our toll-free number, and we’ll provide answers or direct voters on where to go for more information.”

The 1-866-OUR-VOTE Hotline is available now through Election Day, with trained Election Protection volunteers and legal experts available to provide direct assistance to voters in Colorado and across the country. On Election Day, all calls from Colorado voters will be answered at Colorado’s call center, located in downtown Denver at Rocky Mountain PBS (1089 Bannock St). The media is invited to attend.
