**3. Mail Ballots/Requests.**

**4. Accessibility for voters with disabilities.**

- Did your training include useful information on how to interact with voters with disabilities?
- Do you know how to set up your polling place so that it is fully accessible for voters with disabilities, including those who use wheelchairs, walkers, canes or crutches?

  - is blind?
  - is deaf?
- Do you know what to do if a voter requests assistance in voting due to a disability? Who may assist a voter with disabilities? When is the Voter Assistance Form required?
- If you are a voting machine judge, do you feel comfortable with showing a voter how to use the accessible features of your voting system?
